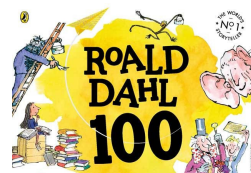


Roald Dahl Day

Want to help your child with their learning?

Here are 4 top tips:

1. Listen them to them read for a few minutes each day. A little and often is the key.
2. Log on to Reading Eggspress / Reading Eggs. This is a brilliant website with a wide range of books available for your child/ren to read. Again, a little and often is the key. Pupils should have their password in their reading diaries.
3. Log on to EasiMaths. This fabulous website will support you child with their maths. Pupils learn form playing a range of fun maths games. Keeping pupils wanting to participate, just 10 to 15 minutes per day, 3 to 5 times per week can deliver great improvements rather than concentrated, drawn out sessions. Pupils should have their password in their reading diaries.
4. Visit your local library.
